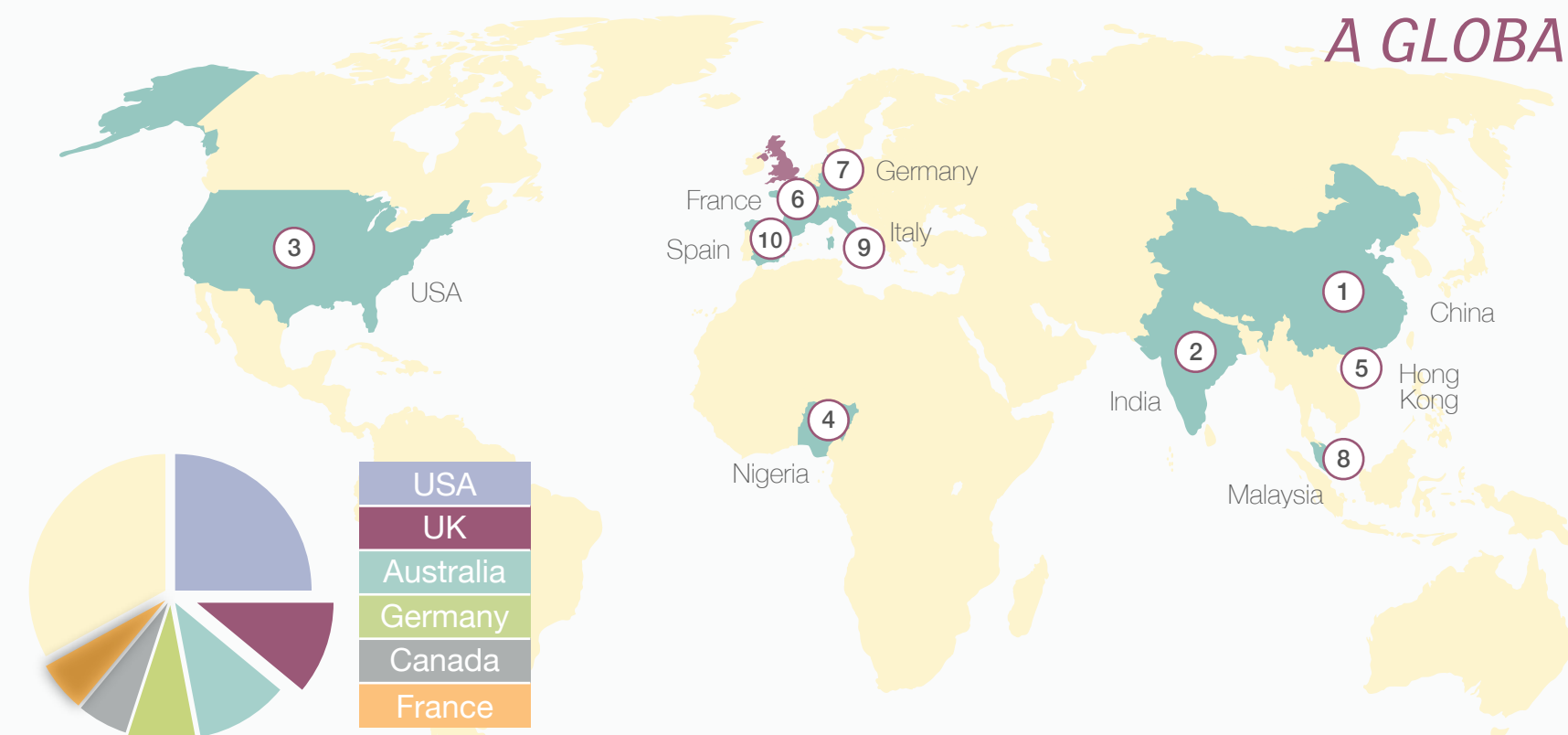

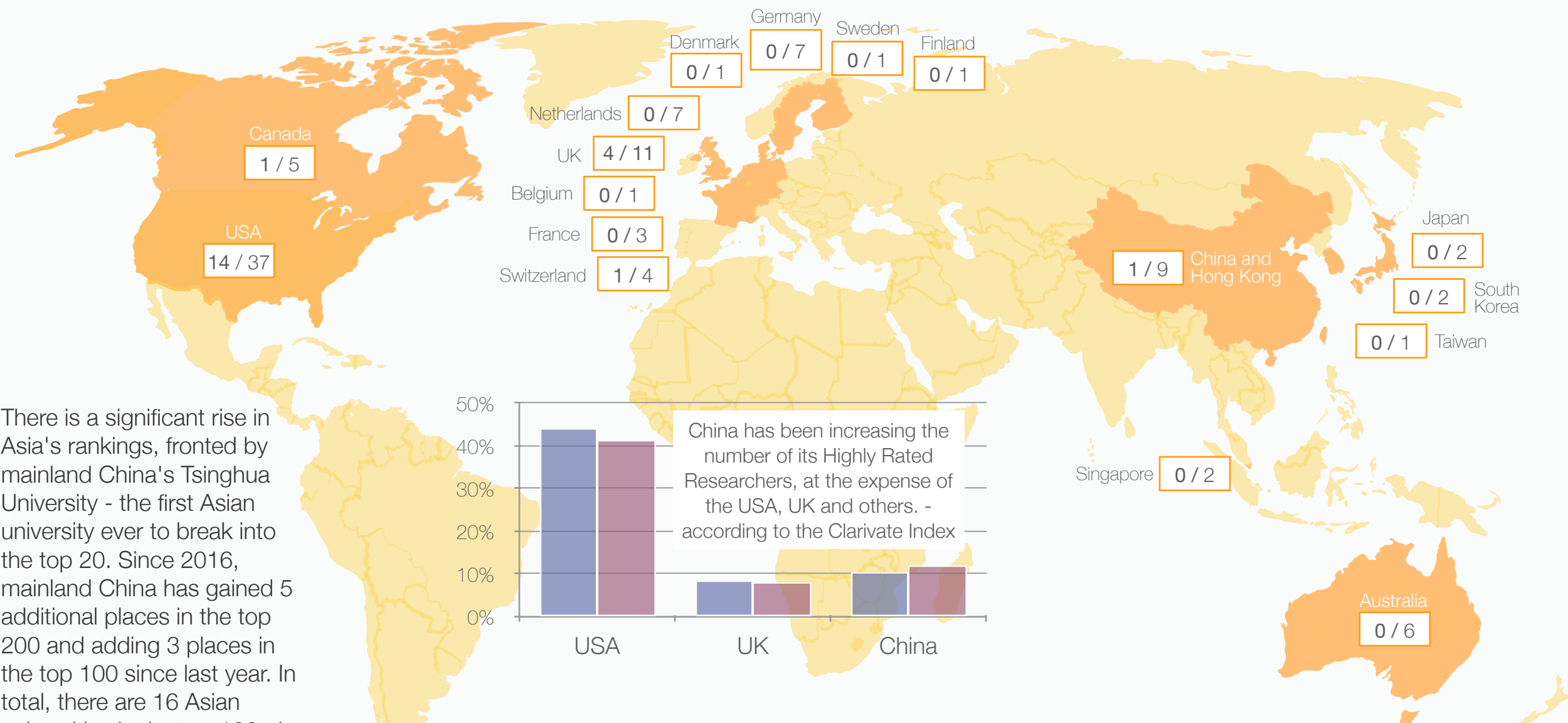
TOP COUNTRIES IN ATTRACTING OVERSEAS STUDENTS (2019)

China sent almost **102,000** first year students to the UK in 2019/20 - more than the rest of the top 10 combined.

**39%** of all first year students in the UK were from overseas.

### AN ASIAN RENAISSANCE?

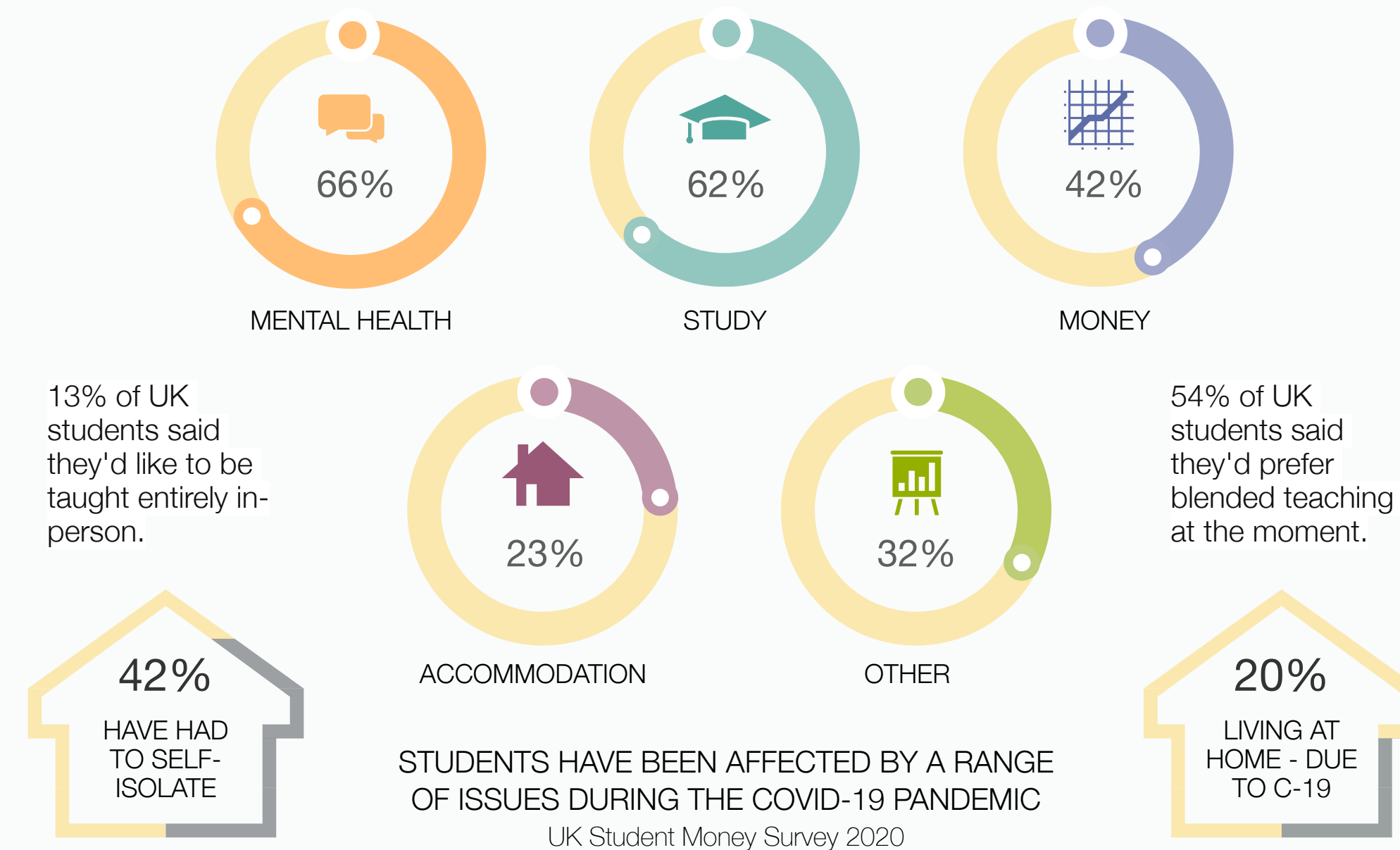


There is a significant rise in Asia's rankings, fronted by mainland China's Tsinghua University - the first Asian university ever to break into the top 20. Since 2016, mainland China has gained 5 additional places in the top 200 and adding 3 places in the top 100 since last year. In total, there are 16 Asian universities in the top 100, the highest total for Asia since the rankings began.
